Applications Due Date – June 1, 2026

Texas Pest Management Association (TPMA) is the only statewide, multi-commodity, non-profit, producer organization in Texas dedicated to the development and implementation of Integrated Pest Management (IPM) programs. IPM programs in Texas have provided increased profitability and environmental stability for agriculture through research, education, and application.

TPMA is a grower funded and grower managed organization that cooperates directly with AgriLife Extension to implement IPM concepts at the grassroots level. The cooperation between TPMA and AgriLife Extension has created an advantageous environment for the moving of practical research from experimental field trials to applied science at the farm level. The Texas program represents an optimal approach of farm growers working directly with Extension personnel to help the program through a continuing evolutionary process. The program has allowed a two-way communication tunnel that allows Cooperative Extension to disseminate program information to growers.

Eligibility Requirements

- Scholarships are open to undergraduate students with 60 or more hours of coursework and graduate students currently in a master's or PhD degree program who are intent on pursuing a degree in integrated pest management or closely related field of study and working in the US agriculture industry following graduation.
- Scholarship recipients must attend a Texas college/university full time.
- Scholarship recipients must be able to provide verification of enrollment.
- Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Must be majoring in Agriculture or a closely related field.
- TPMA scholarships are non-renewable. Previous TPMA Scholarship recipients are not eligible to receive an award at the same educational degree level as a previous award.
- TPMA Board of Directors and account holders are not eligible to apply. Family members of the above-mentioned groups are eligible.
- \$1000.00 will be sent directly to the school upon receipt of all required documentation for the fall and the next \$1000.00 will be sent for the spring semester once a new GPA and transcript are submitted.
- Recipients of the scholarship will be required to send a short video prior to any award disbursement introducing themselves, their major, how their field of study relates to IPM and their plans following graduation. The video will be viewed at the annual TPMA board meeting in January of the following year.
